### 1 Yagoto Koshoji Temple

Established in 1688 by the Tokugawa family in Owari clan, this deeply-forested temple compound including the 5-story pagoda (an important cultural property) has been a spiritual haven to the people in the area. On Buddhist holy days (5, 13, 21 of each month), you can enjoy the traditional Japanese street fair.

### 2 Toganji Temple

This is a temple of Soto sect of Buddhism. The temple was established by Oda Family in the 16th century and houses treasures including a 15m-tall open-air statue of seated Buddha beautifully painted green.

### 1 Nagoya Castle

Nagoya castle was built by the order of Tokugawa Ieyasu in 1612, and it symbolizes Nagoya's pride and power, also characterized by two golden "Shachi" adorning top of the roof. Restoration of Hommaru Palace is currently underway, which was once registered as Japan's National Treasure. Nagoya City has started the restoration project in 2009, which is scheduled to be completed in 2018. Genkan (Entrance hall) and Omote Shoin (Main hall) are now open to the public.

### 3 Atsuta Shrine

With over 1,900 years of history, Atsuta Shrine has been a spiritual home to over 6.5 million people who visit annually. Take a stroll through the extensive wooded grounds, and you may witness weddings and baby blessing ceremonies. A sword, one of the three sacred treasures within Shinto is kept at this shrine.

### 4 Old Town of Arimatsu

This picturesque street lined with old Japanese architecture was an old Edo-period post station town on the Tokaido high way between Kyoto and Tokyo. Its claim to fame is its intricate shibori (tie-dyed fabrics) industry, which has been passed onto today. Visitors can purchase both traditional and more contemporary shibori products in shops and the museum.

### 8 Sakae

This is the shopping and entertainment hub of Nagoya with many department stores and restaurants, as well as the world's largest of underground shopping arcade. Nagoya TV Tower and Oasis 21 bus terminal complex are the area's main landmarks.

### 5 Toyota Commemorative Museum of Industry and Technology

Built in 1911 as a research and development plant for weaving looms by the founder of the Toyota company, Sakichi Toyoda, this museum makes use of the buildings remaining from the main plant of the former Toyoda Boshoku. On display are exhibits about Toyota's move from the production of weaving machines to automobiles, the company's manufacturing research history, and its manufacturing spirit.

### 6 Noritake Garden

Noritake is the world famous tableware brand which originally started the business in Nagoya in 1904. At Welcome Center, visitors can learn about the history of Noritake and the company's craft center through a video presentation on Noritake Garden. The Craft Center is a production factory that manufactures bone china. Visitors can get an up-close view of Noritake's craftsmanship and traditions throughout each process from production of bone china clay to decorations. Join a factory tour to watch painters at work and also paint your own Noritake creation for a fee.
