A Toyoda Auditorium

The Toyoda Auditorium was donated by the Toyota Motor Industry Corporation in 1960, and designed by the architect Fumihiko Maki. The Auditorium became a 'National Registered Tangible Cultural Asset' in 2011.



Noyori Conference Hall

University Professor Ryoii Novori won the 2001 Nobel Prize in chemistry. In honor of this achievement, the Novori Conference Hall, designed by Yoshihiko Iida, was built in 2003, and features a hall, lodging facilities, etc.



In order to support the world-

class education and research, the IB Building (Integrated Building) was built in 2003. Open spaces in the building are designed to create an open atmosphere for visitors to this facility.
